Hillgrove's Spanish Program

O Spanish 1

- You do NOT need a Foreign Language credit to graduate from Hillgrove.
- However, many 2-year and all 4-year colleges will require at least 2 FL credits for entry. The more FL credits you take, the more competitive your application will be.

O Spanish 2 / Spanish 2 Honors

- To get into Honors-level 2, you must have a 93%+ in Spanish 1 as your overall grade
- Honors 2 will give you an extra ½ quality point on your weighted GPA.

O Spanish 3 Honors

- To enter Honors 3, you will need to have earned an 85%+ in a level 2 class
- We begin planning a trip to Europe and/or Latin America at this level, which we will go on when you are either in Spanish 4 or 5 (depends on the calendar).
- Completing level 3 earns you a Foreign Language pathway.

Hillgrove's Spanish Program

O Spanish 4 Honors

- To get into Honors-level 4, you must have an 85%+ in Spanish 3 as your overall grade.
- Participate in a travel opportunity to Europe or Latin America.
- You will earn 1 full quality point toward your weighted GPA.

O Spanish 5 Honors (Pre-AP)

- To get into Honors-level 5, you must have an 85% in Spanish 4 as your overall grade
- You will earn 1 full quality point toward your weighted GPA.
- O You may apply to be a member of Spanish Honor Society

O Spanish 6 (AP Spanish)

- You will earn 1 full quality point toward your weighted GPA.
- Taking the AP exam will allow you to earn up to 12 college credits (4 classes!)

Grading Categories

• Formative Assessments (35%)

(classwork, homework, warmups, computer lab work, practice, rough drafts, etc.)

O Summative Assessments (35%)

(projects, presentations, unit tests)

O Quizzes (20%)

O Final Exam (10%)

(Cumulative final exam that will assess listening, reading, vocabulary, and grammar skills)

O Make-up Policy & Restrictions

A student may make up all missed work due to absence. When there is an absence, it is the **student's responsibility** to check CTLS for missed lessons and assignments.

Any make-up appointments for quizzes and tests should be arranged in a timely manner with the teacher to take place before or after school, or during Hawk Hour.

If an assessment has been announced prior to an absence, the student will take the assessment as scheduled. Teacher discretion will be used for extended absences or extenuating circumstances.

O Homework

Each day students will receive independent work to complete during class time. Any incomplete portion of that assignment should be completed that night for homework and turned in the next day before class begins. NO late work will be accepted except in the event of an absence or extenuating circumstance that should be communicated to the teacher BEFORE the assignment is due.

Classwork/Homework grades are worth 10-points per assignment in the Formative category.

O Extra Credit?

NO extra credit work will be given to substitute or take the place of another grade.

Please note: If final grades are on the border (69, 79, 89, etc.) they will NOT be adjusted/bumped up to the next letter grade.



Before class time: if you ask to use the restroom before the "hawk squawk" I will always let you go! Come in, drop your things, and go!

Students should use the restroom during class change, and instruction should not be interrupted except for emergencies.

Students will receive a personal Hall Pass sheet with 10 passes to use for the duration of the semester.

The first and last 15 minutes of class are "secured time" when no student is permitted to be in the hall.

OLate Work Without an Absence

If a student comes to class without a project (summative assignment) on the day it is due, a letter grade will be deducted from the overall project grade. A zero will be entered into Synergy until the assignment is submitted. If the project is not submitted before the end of the unit, a permanent grade of zero will remain in Synergy. Teacher discretion will be used for extenuating circumstances.



Tutoring is available each week during Hawk Hour.

Cell Phone Policy

The use of electronic devices will be permitted at the teacher's discretion only for specific instructional and educational purposes. - This year I am coaching JV Girls Soccer!


