

## Translate to Spanish.

**\*Be careful, every statement is NOT reflexive.**

1. In the morning, my dad takes a shower, shaves and gets dressed.  
*Por la mañana, mi padre se ducha, se afeita y se viste.*
2. In the shower, I need shampoo, soap and shaving cream.  
*En la ducha, necesito el champú, el jabón, la crema de afeitar.*
3. When my mom feels sad, she takes a bath.  
*Cuando mi mamá se siente triste, se baña.*
4. My sisters always put on make-up in the mirror.  
*Mis hermanas siempre se maquillan en el espejo.*  
*Mis hermanas siempre se ponen el maquillaje en el espejo.*
5. Do you shower at night or in the morning?  
*¿Te duchas por la noche o por la mañana?*

Translate to Spanish. \*Be careful! These are all 2 verb statements. Watch for present progressive (Estar +ando/iendo) and infinitive phrases.

1. **I need to go to bed** early.  
*Necesito acostarme temprano.*  
*Me necesito acostar temprano.*
2. **We should wash our hands before eating.**  
*Debemos lavarnos las manos antes de comer.*  
*Nos debemos lavar las manos antes de comer.*
3. Carlos **is going to shave and shower.**  
*Carlos va a afeitarse y ducharse.*  
*Carlos se va a afeitar y duchar.*
4. Amelia and Sarah **are putting on make-up.**  
*Amelia y Sarah están poniéndose el maquillaje.*  
*Amelia y Sarah están maquillándose.*  
*Amelia y Sara se están maquillando / poniendo el maquillaje.*
5. **After showering,** my parents brush their teeth and put on pajamas, then they go to bed.

*Después de ducharse, mis padres se cepillan los dientes, se ponen los pijamas, y entonces se acuestan.*

What is the PRESENT PROGRESSIVE? What is the rule when conjugating with the combo of a reflexive verb and the present progressive?

Estar plus -ando or iendo

You cannot just use the action verb without estar!!

You can put the pronoun before the first verb or attached to the second. If you attach be sure to add an accent

Me estoy duchando.

Estoy duchándome.

What are the following infinitive phrases? What is the rule when conjugating with the combo of an infinitive phrase and a reflexive verb.

- need to - **necesitar**
- have to – **tengo que**
- want to - **Querer**
- going to – **ir a**
- should - **deber**
- before – **antes de**
- after – **después de**

Change the first verb, leave the second as an infinitive.

Necesito Ducharme

Me necesito duchar.
